Parking Do's and Don'ts | Pedestrian Safety

Speed Limits

As noted on the sign near the front entrance, there are a number of young children living and playing at Galleria.



The speed limit at Galleria is 15 mph.

Slow down if you see children, dog walkers or pedestrians

Not all areas at Galleria have sidewalks. Mailboxes, some trash collection areas and garage areas are shared pedestrian/vehicle areas.

No Parking Areas

Other than the numbered visitor parking spaces, no parking is permitted on Galleria Streets or the garage areas, even if the curbs are not painted red.

Access must be maintained for Fire and Emergency Vehicles.

Resident/Host Responsibilities for and to visitors

It is the responsibility of owners, or tenants, to inform guests of the Galleria parking regulations.

"I didn't know" will not stop a tow truck operator once a vehicle is on the hook.



Visitor Parking at Galleria

- There are 42 numbered non-resident parking spaces.
- Vehicles must fit between the white lines in both width and length and may not extend past the end of the white lines.
- Visitor parking is for short, not extended, periods.
- Long vehicles might possibly fit if backed into a spot. Overhangs must not block sidewalk access or impede wheelchairs, strollers or baby buggies. Please respect you neighbors.
- If there are no open visitor parking places, or if your vehicle will not fit in a space, additional parking is available on Village Center Lane between Galleria and Elan. A map on the front wall of the Pool Building to help locate the overflow parking. Three sidewalks provide access from Village Center Lane into Galleria.
- As noted in the posted signs "All violators will be towed".
- If your vehicle is towed, a towing information sign is posted at the Galleria entrance off River Oaks, on the right side of the drive next to the pool fence.
